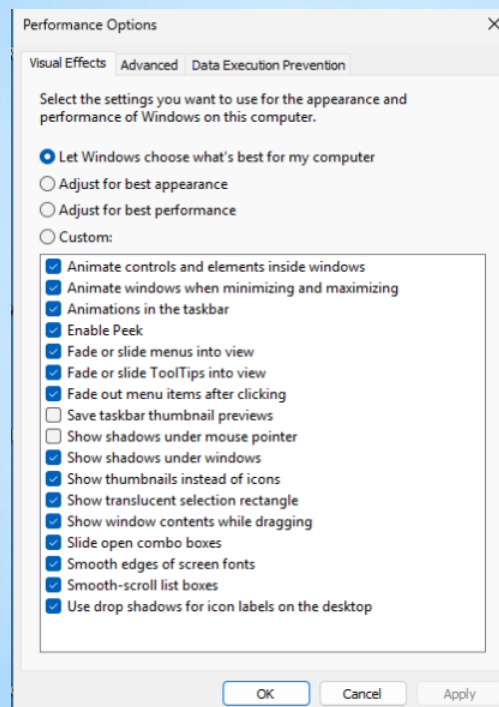


Adjusting Windows visual effects – speed improvement?

You can adjust visual effects in Windows.

These are the visual flourishes Windows displays on the screen—such as those seen when closing windows or moving the mouse, as well as window shadows, and so on.

You can launch these settings directly by entering "systempropertiesperformance" into the Run dialog or the search bar.



These effects primarily impact the Windows interface.

If you turn them all off, Windows seems to respond faster, but this is merely a visual impression. On modern computers, these settings have no impact on speed. With older hardware, however, it might make a slight difference.

You can customize these settings to your liking and try them out individually, or simply leave them at the recommended

"Let Windows choose what's best for my computer" setting. 😊
